### Delhi

Arrive Delhi in the evening, after going through customs and immigration our representative will be meeting us for transfer in an air-conditioned coach Hotel Park - <http://newdelhi.theparkhotels.com/> .

The Park, New Delhi is situated in the heart of the city's business and entertainment hub. It overlooks the historic 18th century Jantar Mantar Observatory and is in the city's hub - Connaught Place. A busy urban junction, its spacious banquet halls, restaurants all hustle with activity. The accommodations are models of refined luxury, personal touch and superior amenities and services. Public spaces and guest rooms are lined with handpicked contemporary art. A place to retire and recharge, it reflects the electric energy of the city.

01 March

### Delhi

(B)

**Breakfast** at hotel. This morning our guide report at the hotel and take you for a full day sightseeing of the premier sights of **Old and New Delhi**.  
**Overnight hotel The Park.**

*India's capital city, Delhi is the second most widely used entry point in the country, being on the route of most major airlines. It is well linked by rail, air and road to all parts of the country. The remains of seven distinctive capital cities - among them Shahjahanabad and Qutab Minar - can be seen.*

*Here, museums, art galleries and cultural centres attract the finest exhibitions and performances from India and Abroad. Shopping encompasses virtually everything that can be bought in the country. Hotels range from the deluxe to the more modest. Most fascinating of all is the character of Delhi which varies from 13th century mausoleum of the Lodi kings set in sprawling park to ultra modern chrome and glass skyscrapers; and from imperial India's Parliament House and the President's Palace to the never ending bustle of the walled city surrounding Jama Masjid. Delhi also makes the ideal base for a series of short excursions to neighbouring places, all connected by road.*

*Delhi, the capital of India houses some of the magnificent monuments built from 12th century monuments onwards - The Red Fort, Qutab Minar, Humayun's Tomb, Jama Masjid, India Gate (War Memorial), Parliament House, President's House, Bahai Temple (The Lotus Temple) are worth a*

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*visit. Besides, there are number of interesting museums. The most important ones are National Museum - the premier museum of India, National Gallery of Modern Art, Rail Museum and Gandhi Museum.*

**02 March**

**Delhi – Agra**

**(B)**

**Breakfast at hotel.** Early departure in an air-conditioned coach for Agra, a journey of 4-5 hours. On arrival, check into the **Hotel Oberoi Trident**. In the afternoon, a guide will report at your hotel and take you to view the **Agra Fort and Taj Mahal**.

**Overnight Hotel Oberoi Trident Agra** Agra Trident Hotel - <http://tridenthotels.com>

*Like Delhi, Agra stands on the Right Bank of the river Yamuna. The romance of the world's most famous building still astonishes in its power. In addition to the Taj Mahal, Agra houses the great monuments of the Red Fort and the I'timad-ud-Daulah.*

*When the Taj Mahal was constructed, the Mughal Empire was already past its prime. He Taj, despite its unquestionable beauty, was an extravagance, which the Empire could not afford. For the last eight years of his life Shah Jahen was imprisoned by his son, Aurangzeb and confined to his marble palace at the Agra Fort.*

*The Taj Mahal is the eternal monument of love built by the fifth Mughal Emperor, Shah Jahen in the everlasting memory of his beloved wife, Mumtaz Mahal. It is believed that it took 22 years to build and 10,000 people worked on it.*

Trident, Agra is set amidst beautiful gardens and is only a few minutes away from the famous Taj Mahal. The hotel is built of the red stone reminiscent of the Mughal era, designed around landscaped central courtyard with swimming pool and fountains.

It has 138 elegantly furnished rooms that include rooms for the physically challenged, Suites and a non-smoking section. All rooms are centrally air-conditioned and equipped with modern facilities like a mini-bar, complimentary tea and coffee making facility, direct dial telephone, data port connectivity, television set with satellite transmission and a personal safe.

**03 March**

**Agra - Jaipur**

**(B)**

**Breakfast at hotel.** Depart for **Jaipur**, a journey of 5-6 hours. Enroute stop at **Fatehpur Sikri**, the lost city. Proceed to Jaipur and check into the **Hotel Oberoi Trident**.

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*37 kms from Agra this city predominantly built in Red Sandstone is called Fatehpur Sikri. This town was built by the Mughal Emperor, Akbar. He had planned this city as his capital but shortage of water compelled him to abandon the city. After this within 20 years, the capital of Mughals was shifted to Lahore. Fatehpur Sikri was built during 1571 and 1585. Today this ghost city has a population of about 30,000. This deserted city has retained many of the old structures, because of the efforts of the Archaeological department.*

*Fatehpur Sikri is one of the finest examples of Mughal architectural splendour at its height. Though the city is in ruins, it is a place to visit if one comes to Agra. But in real terms Fatehpur Sikri is a place where one should spend some time. The sunset over the ruins is sight to cherish. Fatehpur Sikri is the best example of the culmination of Hindu and Muslim architecture. Fatehpur Sikri Mosque is said to be a copy of the mosque in Mecca and has designs, derived from the Persian & Hindu architecture.*

Situated en route to Jaipur's renowned Amer Fort, **Trident, Jaipur**, looks out on to the scenic Mansagar lake and the picturesque Aravalli ranges. The hotel has 137 rooms that overlook the Mansagar Lake or the Aravalli range. Elegantly furnished, the rooms are equipped with mini-bars, complementary tea and coffee making facilities, direct dial telephones and television sets with satellite transmission, as well as wifi connectivity.

**04 March**

**Jaipur**

**(B,L)**

**Breakfast at hotel.** Our guide today will take us to the **Amber fort**, which you view on elephant back. Proceed to see the **City Palace, Palace of Winds, the observatory and the local interesting market.**

**Lunch at a local restaurant.**

Overnight **Hotel Oberoi Trident Jaipur..** <http://tridenthotels.com>

*Sawai Jai Singh II, the Maharaja of the Kachhwaha clan of Rajputs, who ruled from 1699 -1744, founded Jaipur (The City of Victory) in 1727. Some writers such as Davies suggest that the City Palace is a "spectacular synthesis of Rajput and Mughal architecture of supreme assurance", Tillotson argues that its "derivative and irresolute design shows that the Rajput style was built for the ladies of the harem of Sawai Pratap Singh. The windows enabled cool air to circulate and the zenana ladies to watch processions below without being seen.*

*Also visit, Amber, the ancient capital of the Kachhwaha Rajputs from 1037 until Sawai Jai Singh II moved to the newly created Jaipur. The building of the fort-palace was begun by Raja Man Singh, a noted Rajput*

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*general in Akbar's army in 1600, and was later added to by successive rulers. The architecture shows distinct Mughal influence.*

**05 March Jaipur – Jodhpur (B)**

**Breakfast at hotel.** Early departure for Jodhpur by road, a journey of 5 hours. Check into the **Hotel Ajit Bhawan Palace** and then proceed to view the **Meherangarh fort**.

Overnight **Hotel Ajit Bhawan Palace**. <http://www.ajitbhawan.com/>

*Jodhpur stands at the edge of the Thar Desert and is the largest city of Rajasthan after Jaipur. Dominated by the massive Meherangarh fort, topping a sheer rocky ridge, which rises right in the middle of the town. From the windows of the palace, one can see the blue-wash Brahmin houses. For the Rajput princes the Brahmins represented a vital avenue to authentic power.*

*Once on the strategic Delhi - Gujarat trading route, the traffic of opium, copper, silk, sandalwood, dates, coffee etc. took place.*

India's first Heritage Palace Resort, "The Ajit Bhawan", is a home to the members of the Jodhpur Royal family. Set in the serene desert of Rajasthan, Ajit Bhawan stands as an oasis of hospitality and warm Rajput charm. Built exclusively for Maharaja Sir Ajit Singhji Rathore, the younger brother of Maharaja Umaid Singhji of the erstwhile Jodhpur state.

The Ajit Bhawan offers you Old World Elegance with the modern comforts of a classic heritage resort and the essence of being a guest of the Maharaja's family.

**06 March Jodhpur – Khimsar (B,D)**

**Breakfast at hotel.** Depart for **Khimsar fort**, a journey of 2 hours.

**Dinner with a cultural show** arranged on the ramparts of the fort.

Overnight **Heritage Fort Hotel at Khimsar**. <http://www.khimsar.com/>

*Khimsar was founded 2000 years ago by the Jain Saint Mahavir and is the start of the Great Indian Desert. It is a remote 15th century Rajput fort in the desert where the Mughal Emperor, Aurangzeb is believed to have stayed. Karam Singh, the fifth son of Rao Jodha, built the moated castle as a fortified home. Over the centuries, it has been expanded by each generation and this is evident in its diverse architectural style.*

This magnificent fort is literally off the beaten track. Set in the midst of sand dunes, this amazing fort stands as securely as it did over many centuries of battle and strife. The construction of the fort was begun in

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1523 by Rao Karamsinghji, 8th son of the founder of Jodhpur Rao Jodha, who chose the spot of Khimsar, 90 km from Jodhpur where one brother resided and 150 km away from Bikaner, fiefdom of another brother.

Twenty-one generations later, a part of this fort is still residence to the Karamsot Rathore direct lineage while the rest has been opened out to royal Rajput hospitality, personally overseen by the family, on a grand and elegant scale. It was for good cause that the Tourism Board of the Government of India awarded the 'Grand Heritage Award for Excellence' it. While Khimsar Fort borders the stark and arid Thar Desert, day and brilliant unending stars cocoon you within the ramparts of this oasis of comfort with its 11 acres of lush lawns under the canopy of bright clear skies by night.

**07 March      Khimsar      (B, L, D)**  
**Breakfast at hotel.** Relax in the beautiful environs of the fort and later take a **jeep safari** through black buck country and sand dunes. Return to fort for **dinner. Lunch at a local restaurant.**  
Overnight **Heritage Fort Hotel at Khimsar.**

**08 March      Khimsar – Rohetgarh      (B)**  
**Breakfast at hotel.** This morning, proceed to **Rohetgarh**, a journey of 3-4 hours and check into the charming heritage property of **Rohet House.**  
**Overnight Rohetgarh Heritage Hotel.**  
<http://www.rohetgarh.com/home.htm>

In January 1990 we opened its gates to receive the discerning traveler. To share with him our heritage, and give him a glimpse of our land with its brilliant colours, where culture and tradition are deep-rooted and vibrant & its people - so deeply civilized! Today Rohet Garh is a leading Heritage Hotel, where the experience goes far beyond the high walls of the Garh (Fort). It is home first and Hotel after.

**09 March      Rohetgarh      (B, L)**

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**Breakfast at hotel.** Enjoy a morning **village safari** after breakfast and return to witness a **cooking demonstration**. **Lunch included.**  
**Overnight Rohetgarh Heritage Hotel.**

*Rohetgarh is on the main highway between Jodhpur and Udaipur. It is also on the way from the famed Ranakpur temples. The Jain community has a history closely intertwined with that of the Hindus of Mewar. The Ranakpur temples are the most complex and extensive of Jain temples in India, covering over 40,000 sq. ft. It has 29 halls containing 1,444 pillars; each carved with intricate, delicate carvings. The temple is built on a high plinth, encircled by lofty boundary walls with graceful turrets.*

*Rohetgarh is the very heart of Rajasthan where traditions, centuries old still permeate lifestyles. A Bishnoi village - steeped in history: 450-year-old tribe has a distinctive way of life. They are environmentalists in the fundamental sense, preserving the wilds in scientific and logical routines evolved over the centuries of living with nature.*

*In villages of other tribes, one can witness the opium ceremony - a ritual by which guests are traditionally welcomed. The story goes that the 350-year-old ruler's house has attracted several writers here such as Bruce Chatwin and the famous; City of Djinn's writing by William Dalrymple began in this same hotel (room no 14).*

**10 March**

**Rohetgarh – Udaipur**

**(B)**

**Breakfast at hotel.** This morning we proceed by road to **Udaipur**, a journey of 4 hours. Optional stop enroute at the famous **marble Ranakpur Temples**.

**Overnight Hotel Oberoi Trident Udaipur.**

*RANAKPUR: One of the five holy Jain sites, it has one of the best known Jain temple complex in the country. It is particularly noted for the grandiose scale of its architecture. The secluded wooded setting, home to peacocks, langurs, and numerous birds, complements the buildings wonderfully. This is a popular pilgrimage centre.*

Trident, Udaipur is located on the banks of the picturesque Pichola Lake and is ten minutes drive from the city center. Forty-three acres of land with lush green landscaping surrounds the hotel. The hotel provides a perfect base to explore the fabled city of Udaipur, acclaimed worldwide for its beautiful lakes, medieval palaces and colourful bazaars. All rooms are furnished in shades of beige and light cream. The architecture reflects the ancient heritage of Udaipur city.

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**11 March Udaipur (B, L)**  
**Breakfast at hotel.** This morning we will take you for a full day of sightseeing including the **boat ride on lake Pichola. Lunch at a local restaurant.**  
**Overnight Hotel Oberoi Trident Udaipur.**

*Udaipur referred to as 'The City of Sunrise' is located in the midst of the Aravalli hills of South Rajasthan and is a beautiful city. In contrast to some of its desert neighbours it presents an enchanting image of white marble palaces, placid blue lakes and green hills. The Lake Palace has a superb location on Jag Niwas Island. Once a summer residence the hotel seems to float like a dream ship on the blue waters of the lake.*

**12 March Udaipur – Sardargarh Mahal (B, L)**  
**Breakfast at hotel.** Depart to **Sardargarh**, a journey of 1 ½ - 2 hours and check into the **Fort of Sardargarh. Lunch** included.  
**Overnight Sardargarh Heritage Hotel – [www.sardargarh.in](http://www.sardargarh.in)**

Sardargarh, one of the magnificent forts of Rajasthan, is an extravagant creation by men of a bygone era, placed amidst the mountains and deep forests of Chuppun. Sardar Singh, one of the most powerful Dhodhias, built the Sardargarh Fort during 1738 to 1743. You can see the ramparts of the mystery filled Sardargarh, like a great ship anchored at outer sea, much before you get close to the gigantic walls soaring high above the low lying village of Lawa. Magnificent fort of Sardargarh is situated 94km north from Udaipur.

**13 March Sardargarh (B, D)**  
**Breakfast at hotel.** Visit the **Banjara village where the Kalbeliya Tribes live.**  
**Evening boating in the lake. Campfire and dinner.**  
**Overnight Sardargarh Heritage Hotel – [www.sardargarh.in](http://www.sardargarh.in)**

**14 March Sardargarh - Deogarh Khayyam (B, L)**  
**Breakfast at hotel.** After breakfast, proceed to **Deogarh Khayyam**, a journey of 2-3 hours (40km). **Lunch included.**  
**Overnight Deogarh Heritage tents - [http://www.deogarhmahal.com/camp\\_anjana.htm](http://www.deogarhmahal.com/camp_anjana.htm)**

For the nature loving, there are sixteen exquisitely made heritage tents, situated in the midst of eucalyptus trees and a beautiful lakeside. These tents are so luxurious that one is tempted to call them 'Deogarh

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Khayyams.' The tents are water proof on the outside, and have mesmerizing interiors which originate from an old design. Comfort is of utmost importance and is well noticeable by the little detail everywhere, right from the hot water in the showers to the cosy hot water bottles placed in the beds.

- 15 March Deogarh Khayyam (B, D)**  
**Breakfast.** Today we will **travel through the village** on a **train ride**. There is plenty to do and at one's own pace. **Morning walks, bird watching and village tours are a treat, and sitting outside under the starry night sky with a blazing fire is simply divine.** **Dinner included.**  
**Overnight Deogarh Heritage tents.**
- 16 March Deogarh Khayyam – Ajmer by road. By train to Delhi. (B)**  
**Breakfast.** In the afternoon, proceed to **Ajmer to board the fast train to Delhi in Executive class chair car.** Met on arrival at New Delhi railway station and transferred to **Hotel Park.**  
**Overnight Hotel Park.**
- 17 March Delhi / Kathmandu or Return flight (B)**  
**Breakfast at hotel.** Check out by noon from your hotel. Coach **to transfer you to the International airport** for onward flight.

**KATHMANDU, NEPAL – 2 nights / 3 days**

**March 17 - Kathmandu**

**Arrival in Kathmandu.** After immigration and customs, **our representative will meet outside the arrival terminal building and transfer to hotel Yak & Yeti.**

This afternoon - **Half day tour of Kathmandu Durbar Square and Swoyambhunath Stupa.**

**Kathmandu City:** *Kathmandu Durbar Square* (listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO) is one of the popular places liked by many visitors due to its exquisite architecture and artistic embellishment. The complex of palaces, courtyards and temples, built in 1200 to 1768 A.D. with hundreds of erotic carvings used to be the seat of the ancient Malla kings of Kathmandu which epitomizes the religions and cultural life of the people.

**Swoyambhunath** (listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO): Atop a green hillock west of Kathmandu, stands the great stupa of Swoyambhunath. This is a site that is over 2500 years old marking the point where the legendary patriarch Manjushri discovered the lotus of the ancient valley lake. Constructed to specific rules each with a symbolic meaning, the stupa of Swoyambhunath is a model of its kind.

**Overnight Hotel Yak & Yeti <http://www.yakandyeti.com/>**

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**March 18 – Kathmandu**

**(B, D)**

Early morning transfer to domestic airport for one hour flight over the Everest – Bhuda Air or similar. Return to hotel.

**Breakfast. This morning,** half day day tour of Pashupathnath Temple & Baudhanath Stupa

**Pashupatinath Temple** (listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO): Dedicated to Lord Shiva it is one of the most sacred Hindu shrines in the world. It lies 5 km. east of the city on the bank of the sacred Bagmati River. Thousands of pilgrims visit this temple every year during Shivaratri, the birthday of Lord Shiva. Entrance to the temple precinct is forbidden to non-Hindus. The Large, gilded triple-roofed temple was built in 1696 A.D. though 300 years earlier there was a structure on this site.

**Boudhanath** (listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO): This is the largest stupa in Nepal and one of the largest in the world located east of the valley. It was built by the Lichchhavi King Mana Dev in the 5<sup>th</sup> century A.D. The Rinpoches who reside here have established Boudhnath as one of the most flourishing centres of Tibetan Buddhism in the world. The colossal ancient stupa is 36 metres high.

Afternoon: **Half day tour of Bhankapur Durbar Square.**

**Bhaktapur:** A former capital of the valley, it was once a flourishing city on the trade route to Tibet. It has preserved its traditional character better than the other two cities, due to its more isolated location. It is regarded today as a classic showcase of medieval Nepalese town life. It is situated in the east of Kathmandu valley about 14 km. away. It today retains much of its beauty in ornate woodcarvings and in the famed Golden Gate.

**Nepali Dinner with cultural show at Krishnarpan Restaurant (Hotel Dwarikas).**

**Overnight Hotel Yak & Yeti**

**March 19 - Kathmandu / Delhi / Return**

**Morning: Half day tour of Patan Durbar Square.**

**Patan:** Patan is one of the most historically important city of the Kathmandu valley. It is known as the centre of fine arts and for the superb craftsmanship of its artisans. Essentially a Buddhist city, historic inscriptions establish Patan as an important town from early times (said to have been founded by Emperor Ashoka in the 3<sup>rd</sup> century B.C., although no historical proof exists).

The Patan Durbar Square (listed as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO) has been acclaimed as one of the finest urban streetscapes in the world. Most of the monuments seen today were built between the 16<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> centuries.
